Last week, the Department of Energy announced an exciting new federal funding opportunity for clean energy technology manufacturers.

The Recovery Act included a section that I helped author to make loan guarantees to help promote clean energy technologies. As part of that effort, the Department of Energy launched the Commercial Technology Manufacturing Systems and Components solicitation, a \$750 million loan guarantee solicitation for clean energy manufacturing projects.

Michigan businesses that plan to manufacture commercial renewable energy technologies like energy storage systems or components for wind turbines or photovoltaic systems are encouraged to apply for the program. The manufacturing solicitation will consist of a two-step process with rolling deadlines. The first Part I deadline is September 30, 2010, and the first Part II deadline is November 30, 2010. Final Part I applications are due November 30, 2010 and final Part II applications are due January 31, 2011. Applicants are strongly encouraged to get their applications in early since projects must meet all statutory and regulatory requirements and commence construction no later than September 30, 2011. 9TH ANNUAL MACC RAFFLE DRAWING ON OCTOBER 14

For the ninth year in a row, the Mason Area Chamber of Commerce will hold its community raffle, with the drawing this year on Thursday, October 14, 2010. At 8:00 p.m. that evening at the **VFW 7309** Hall, 1243 Hull Road (just south of Mason), a grand prize worth between \$5,000 and \$15,000 cash will go to the lucky holder of the winning \$20 ticket in the "On the Town" MACC raffle (ML#R05742), sponsored by **LAFCU**.

"Now everyone in the community can afford to participate in this important fundraising effort," says MACC Raffle chair **Ron Tatro**. "The chance of winning up to \$15,000 cash is a great incentive for making a small \$20 investment in the Mason area."

Tickets are available from Chamber volunteers throughout the Mason community. Remaining MACC raffle tickets are also available, while they last, at the Chamber office, which is at 148 E. Ash Street in downtown Mason, from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. weekdays.

If at least 1500 of the 2000 available tickets are sold, the prize will be \$15,000 maximum. If less than 1500 are sold in advance of the drawing, the raffle reverts to a "50/50 basis," with a minimum prize of \$5,000. As always, applicable taxes are the responsibility of the winner. You need not be present to win. Net proceeds go to benefit the Mason Area Chamber of Commerce's "Hometown U.S.A." programs that create so much value for the community. Mason's community identity advertising, banners, publications, visitors' center, and more are all partially funded by the proceeds.

"This year we'd still like to put some of the raffle proceeds money away to eventually buy Christmas decorations for the streetlight poles on North Cedar Street," says MACC raffle chair **Ron Tatro**. "We put more banners up this year, and would like to do more year around to provide a visible welcome for visitors and residents."

Three hours before the grand prize drawing at 8:00 p.m., MACC raffle ticket holders may begin to gather at 5:00 p.m. Admission is free. A cash bar will be available during that time, along with complimentary snack items. To accommodate more ticket holders in the evening's events, there will be no dinner served this year. Unlike the Chamber parties of years past when ticket prices were \$100 each, the bar and food costs are not covered by the regular MACC raffle ticket purchase.

Other things are similar, though. In-house bonus raffles for regular \$20 MACC raffle tickets, drawings for great door prizes, and chances on the \$10 and \$5 "50/50" boards are offered between the hours of 5:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m.

Two "50/50 boards" will contain paper slips numbered from 001 to 500. Each number will be sold for \$5 each on the \$5 board and \$10 each on the \$10 board. The holder of the numbers drawn separately for each board in drawings at 8:00 p.m. will win one-half the value of each board. The \$5 Board will offer all numbers for \$5 each with a potential payoff of \$1,250 to a single winner. The \$10 Board will offer the same numbers for \$10 each with a potential payoff of \$2,500 to a single winner.

All regular ticket holders are entered into the grand prize raffle drawing. There will be no draw down. No other cash prizes, except for the grand prize, will be awarded, but three new merchandise prizes are featured. Ten tickets from the raffle ticket total will be reserved from prior sale and will be offered during the party through ten bonus ticket drawings. Bonus tickets will be sold for each of the ten reserved tickets and the winner of each bonus ticket

drawing will be given a regular raffle ticket.

The final event of the evening is the grand prize drawing to win between \$5,000 and \$15,000 cash. The winner does not need to be present to win. If any MACC raffle tickets remain unsold before October 14, they will be available at the door from 5 to 7 p.m. MACC raffle ticket sales will end at least one hour before the grand prize drawing. All ticket holders and guests must be at least 18 years old.



2010 “On the Town” MACC Raffle Rules:

Only 2000 tickets are available for sale. The winning ticket holders need not be present to win the top prizes. The top prize winners will be selected by random drawing from all valid tickets sold.

The drawings for the top prizes will be conducted by a random drawing method. Shortly before 8:00 PM on October 14, 2010 at the VFW Hall, 1243 Hull Road, south of Mason, officials will place and verify numbered ticket stubs in a drum. These stubs will represent all tickets sold. They will randomize the stubs in the drum and draw ticket stubs as the winners of the top prizes.


The people who own the raffle tickets corresponding to the drawn stubs will be the winners of the top prizes – a grand prize of a maximum \$15,000 cash prize* or, if 1500 tickets are not sold in advance, the grand prize will revert to a 50/50 raffle with a minimum prize of \$5,000* awarded -- a first prize of a 40” HD TV -- a second prize of a HD Blu-Ray Player -- and a third prize of a “Feast of Mason” restaurant certificate package. The top prizes will go to the “Ticket Holders of Record” according to the Mason Area Chamber of Commerce (MACC). A “Ticket Holder of Record” is defined as the person recorded who purchased the ticket from the MACC or its representatives. *Before taxes, subject to federal withholding, all taxes are responsibility of the winner.

The winners of the top prizes and 50/50 boards will take delivery no earlier than Monday, October 18, 2010 at 10:00 AM at the Chamber office, 148 E. Ash Street in downtown Mason. The prizes may be subject to Federal income tax withholding and those monies will be subtracted from the prize and must be immediately paid to the IRS on behalf of the winner.

No persons under age 18 may buy a MACC Raffle Ticket. No organizations or business entities may purchase tickets, unless in the name of specific individuals. If you transfer ownership of your ticket, you must do so prior to October 1, 2010 and you MUST notify the Mason Area Chamber of Commerce by that date. Buyers of tickets must pay for purchases at once, by cash, check, or VISA/MasterCard. Upon issuance of a ticket, all sales are final and non-refundable. Only employees of MACC are ineligible to buy raffle tickets. Until payment is received, ownership of all tickets will remain with the MACC. Ticket holders will not hold the MACC responsible or liable for any accidents, theft, or damages resulting from their participation in this event. Ticket holders, by purchase of a ticket, agree to allow the Chamber to use their names, photos, and statements in promotional material. MACC will share ticket holder information only with participating MACC Raffle sponsors.

The purchase of one \$20 MACC Raffle ticket entitles the “Ticket Holder of Record” to be present at the site for the drawing of the top prizes at 8:00 PM and to be admitted to the hall at no extra charge beginning at 5:00 PM. CASH BAR is available, but no one under 21 years of age may drink alcohol on the premises.

All other 50/50 Board, Door Prize, or Bonus Ticket drawings awarded that evening are drawn from separate and randomized groups of “door prize” style ticket stubs available only to those who are in attendance. The Mason Area Chamber of Commerce, and its records, will have the final word in all transactions and/or disputes. No prizes are to be removed from the premises until the appropriate paperwork has been completed.
